

You'll see there is a new layout, we have a one way system around the church and every other pew is closed.


Please wear a face covering when in church to protect yourself and those around you.

The priest after placing the candle in the stand says


May the light of Christ, rising in glory,


Alleluia, alleluia. I have called you friends, says the Lord,
